## THE ASPE TECH SYMPOSIUM EXPERIENCE!

I am truly grateful for the Chicago ASPE Chapter in bestowing me an opportunity to attend the 2023 ASPE Tech Symposium in Bellevue, WA. It was the first time I ever attended a National ASPE event. I have been an ASPE member for 4 years and entered the Architect/Engineering/ Construction industry a few months after my initial membership. I was looking forward to meeting people in the industry from all over the country and was surprised to meet a member-at-large from Mexico City! In addition to that, learning from the 8 education sessions, which were great to expand upon discussion on crucial topics like improving plumbing design with better codes and design practice.

I signed up for the ASPE Young Professional (AYP) Leadership Academy, which I recommend to any attendee at least once to experience while at a Technical Symposium. The topics covered this year were 'The Positive \& Professional Workplace Environment' and 'Behavior Styles \& Appreciating Our Differences.' I absolutely enjoyed talking to others about their work experiences/tips and understanding our/others various strengths in a team setting. It helps the organization get a better idea of needs that may not be addressed outside of their officer meetings.

Overall my favorite part of the conference is seeing and talking to people involved in the plumbing industry from different walks of life, which you can't get from simply attending a webinar/CEU session. Aspe Symposium Thoughts:
I enjoyed having a space to meet and get to know other people in a relaxed environment.

## The AYP event:

It was cool to be in a small group with people close to my age and career level. This being my first one, and not knowing what the others are like, I found the topic (emotional intelligence) very interesting and insighful. Being engineers, sometimes I think that emotional intelligence is overlooked or underappreciated, but I think it can be super important. I am not sure if the seminar held value for everyone there, but I took a lot from it, that I will try to think about/utilize in my daily life. I think a lot of what was discussed can be applied not only to work life/relationships but to your personal life as well, if not more so. I found myself often thinking of personal relationships and relating them to the topics. And I don't think that's a bad thing. How do we become great at something? You practice it everyday. So while you might not need these lessons and skills everyday in your work life, if you use them in all aspects of your life, your skills will sharpen at an accelerated pace and will stay relevant and fresh in mind when you need to make use of it. All in all, I learned good ways to deal with the personal aspect of business and I learned about myself in the process. The major take away being how to deliver feedback in a way that will have a positive impact.

## Product show:

The product show is a lot smaller than the conventions. But I think this allows one to focus their attention and learn more about what is there instead of trying to make sure you see everyone and end up not learning as much. This product show allowed me to get more value out of the time I spent.

## Tech Sessions:

I learned a tough lesson after my experience going to the technical sessions, which I plan to avoid moving forward by following this advice: Do your research about the sessions ahead of time before you decide which ones to attend. I looked at the descriptions and titles and decided what would benefit my learning the most and I found out that was not enough research to determine which to attend. Obviously, the best preparation is a thorough search into the topics that interest you ahead of time and determining based on that. If you don't have time to read into the topics deeply, I would suggest at least picking topics that sound diverse. Don't put all your eggs in one basket. Plan to learn a little about a lot of topics instead of trying to learn a lot about one or two. I found that the topics with similar subjects or titles ended up having a lot or complete overlap in content. If you still think you want to learn about the topics at least check who the presenter is. If the presenter is the same for a couple of similar sessions, there may be overlap in content and your time might be better spent attending a different session.

Hot off the Press!!!! Wisconsin Administrative Code Changes, the first in 14 years:
The entire list of Plumbing code changes can be found here: Business Information (wi.gov)
Some of these changes may look familiar for those that have worked in states following the International Codes. It'd be so great if there was only one code for the country to follow, but maybe that'd make our careers too easy?

## City of Chicago Updates:

International Code Council - 2027 Codes:
The process of updating the International Building Codes for the 2027 edition has two deadlines. November $1^{\text {st }}$ to get the support and backing from national ASPE who have filed code changes before and know how to make the wording be code-like. The final deadline is January $8^{\text {th }}$, but then you'd be on your own without any oversight from ASPE which means your code change would have less of a chance of making its way through. Thank you to Julius Ballanco for sharing the process he uses to submit code changes during the January 2023 meeting! If you'd like to submit changes with a review first with ASPE's assistance, all proposals WERE required by November $1^{\text {st }}$. Here is a passage from Brianne Hall, VP Legislative Society:

Don't forget about the upcoming code cycles! ASPE's Legislative Committee is accepting changes for the 2027 IPC and UPC code cycles. A Code Change Submittal form is available to complete your submissions. All proposals must be submitted November 1,2023 to allow time for review by the Legislative Committee and Board of Directors prior to code body submission deadlines

## What Does an ASPE Code Change Submittal Look Like?

I submitted a code change suggestion for ASPE's review. On the next page are the 4-pages of my proposed changes. I did not include the excel links for this monthly newsletter, but if you'd be interested in seeing the raw data of what Rational and Manning look like, I'd be more than happy to share. I think anyone sizing storm systems should have the knowledge of understanding where the numbers in the tables from Chapter 11 came from. To trust the sizing tables in Chapter 11 blindly is borderline negligence. Building integrity could be compromised if water does not drain from the roof fast enough. If you're curious or want to discuss openly, please find me at the next ASPE meeting and l'd love to hear your side. I'm familiar enough with Manning coefficients for PVC and cast iron to discuss it over a beer.

## State of Illinois Updates:

## Reasoning:

As engineers, we have an ethical contract to not impose a hazard onto the occupants of the buildings we design. In its current form, the storm piping code imposes a hazard onto the occupants of the buildings we design. If we follow the current storm drain sizing criteria in 1106 and cast iron pipe is used, then the pipes would undersized between 20-50\%, pending the size and slope of the installed pipe. Undersizing roof drain pipes increasing the possibility of the primary

drains being overloaded and water ponding on the roof above what the structural engineer assumed. The printed Tables in code are assuming PVC pipe. We must change this code immediately for the safety of the public.

I fully expect the code listing 2 or 3 tables for horizontal pipes of different Hazen-Williams coefficients of pipe friction rather than an example table illustrating flow rates assuming PVC. My attempt above is to get the code changed. Above is the bare minimum, but I certainly can provide the updated values for various Hazen-Williams coefficients. Cast iron, not sure if there is a $3^{\text {rd }}$ commonly used pipe material, I use PVC or cast iron personally. If I were to be completely honest in my desires, I would change Table 1106.2 to modify the allowable flow in a $5^{\prime \prime}$ PVC pipe to be more accurate, in the provided documents you will see it is off by $20 \%$ while the other values are within $1 \%$. I would also add Table 1106.2 (2) listing the flow rates allowed in horizontal cast iron pipe as follows:
