A MAGAZINE TO CALL OUR OWN

As a long time ASPE member I have had many personal opinions about ASPE feeling the need to create a magazine. Admittedly, my feelings tended to lean toward the negative when *Plumbing Systems and Design* (*PSD*) came on the scene and entered into conflict with the long standing *Plumbing Engineer*. It was not until I was recently at the Region Five Presidents' meeting in Dallas/ Fort Worth, Texas this year that my opinion changed to the positive.

When *PSD* was created in 2002, I had to ask myself why. What I recall was a dispute between ASPE and *Plumbing Engineer* over advertising revenue and magazine delivery to a fixed audience that ASPE provided and ASPE felt it should receive a larger portion of the proceeds. At the time, I viewed ASPE as kicking the golden calf since they got a magazine dedicated to them at no cost or hassle to themselves. I was also worried that the creation of another magazine dedicated to plumbing would not be beneficial to either magazine as they competed for the same advertising dollars from the manufacturers. As a final and most important concern, I was worried that there are only so many plumbing articles and new developments to write and read about. At this point I want to acknowledge another publication that also caters to the plumbing industry, *PM Engineer (PME)*. Since they also focus on the wet side of the mechanical industry (hydronics), *PME* never got embattled with *PSD* for content.

It was in Texas of all places, at the Presidents' meeting while having a nice beverage with the President of the Omaha Chapter that I finally understood what the magazine means to a lot of the members. He said he was really happy that ASPE had "a magazine to call their own." It was that moment of seeing his pride in *PSD* that I was able to see thru the haze. I still think *PE* has something to say and was badly wounded by *PSD*; but, it's long past time to let it go.

 any input you may have.



RIDE TO THE ROCK - PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

The Past

Ken Wentink created the Ride to the Rock a couple years ago in hopes of raising money for the Leukemia Research Foundation (LRF). As the date of the first Ride neared, I learned (as did many others in our Chapter) that Ken had a reason for supporting the LRF – it was the fact that he himself was battling leukemia. I'm sure there were other reasons for creating the ride including the fact that he owned a sweet Harley and probably always looked for a reason to ride! But supporting the LRF seemed the most important. In the first year (2006), only two bikes (Ken's and his neighbor's) showed up. Many folks stayed home due to very threatening weather. Even though the turnout was

light, the event still managed to raise about \$1,300 much to the thanks of donations from ASPE Chicago members and those participating in the 50/50 raffles. Year number two (2007) saw a sharp increase in everything. The event took on a grander presence. Ken joined forces with The Dads' Chapter of the LRF. These folks have fathers who passed away from leukemia. Also, a riding group in Woodstock got involved. Now we had a RIDE! Last year's event included nearly 70 motorcycles and raised upwards of \$7,500 for the LRF!! The Dads' Chapter introduced us to food donations and a raffle that included LOTS of quality items.

The Present

That brings us to the present. You should all know that the 3rd Annual Ride to the Rock was on July 12. The planning for this event was fast and furious. Ken really wanted to run this year's event. Unfortunately, leukemia won its battle with Ken and we had two choices – honor Ken by making the ride happen or just let it go by the wayside and live with our past performance. Well, we decided to make it happen. Several people did not think we would have a chance to do anything like we did last year. However, the whole committee hunkered down and went full steam ahead. Food and monetary donations came in and we even had another fantastic raffle with more than 60 prizes!! You guys, it was AMAZING how this group came together and worked so hard! You should all be proud of your Chapter and the fact that we are involved in such a wonderful event. The numbers for this year were a little lower than last year – 13 bikes (we lost small battles with pre-planned events, NASCAR and the weather), 30-some people total and over \$3,200 donated to the LRF. That does not include the 50/50 raffle monies that have been donated by the Chicago Chapter this year. If you consider how little time we had to make it happen (about 6 weeks), you will realize what an outstanding accomplishment this was! Thanks to the Committee and to all of YOU who have contributed to this and past Rides.

The Future - An Open Challenge to ASPE Chicago

Now we have three motorcycle rallies in our pocket and about \$12,000 donated to the LRF. So, what's next? Do we keep going? Do we quit? I have a vote and by the time you finish reading this you will know what my vote is. I talked with Ken at the very first Ride to the Rock. He told me that his vision for this event was to make it ASPE-wide. No, not just the Chicago Chapter but ALL Chapters in ALL regions!! Can you imagine? I sure can! We already have the infrastructure in place. We have groups who want to work with us – The Dads' Chapter and the Woodstock riders (they really felt bad that they already had plans on the day of our ride). We have many generous donors (many are motorcycle shops) in place. So what else? All we need is someone to step forward and make this event grow the way Ken wanted it to.

You may be asking yourself, "does our little event really make a difference?" or "does the money we donate really help?" My answer to you is a definitive YES! I will give you one example of how these donations and these events make a difference. Something I learned this year I heard from two separate sources and I will use many of the words shared by one of them (my friend S.J. Peters) – research leads to new and improved drugs and techniques for fighting leukemia. Can you believe that it is possible for leukemia to be eradicated in the next 20 years? "Survival rates for kids (under 14) have gone from 20% to 80% since the mid-80's." If that isn't progress, I don't know what is. We ARE helping make a difference!

Have you ever wondered how you might be able to make your mark on this life or make a difference in this world? On a much smaller scale, have you been wondering how you can get more involved with the Chicago Chapter? This is your opportunity my friends. All the pieces are in place - you just need to take the ball and run with it. You will have a LOT of help from people who are not afraid to work (myself included) – I guarantee it. You will start with our Chapter event. And then you can decide how to make this event grow. Maybe we will start with our fellow Chapters in Region 5. And then we can get the other Chapters in the other Regions involved. This could be HUGE!! The only question is – are you up for it? Are you ready for a challenge?

If you think you have what it takes to make the Ride to the Rock grow and to do something to help your fellow man, please contact me. Come on, I'll help you!
