# Let's Talk Water...

I recently attended a couple seminars on Water Quality. Water quality in the greater Chicagoland area is something we should be keeping an eye on. I am not here to alarm you, just making you aware of what is being found in some of the wells, or groundwater aquifers. The levels of concentration are 90% below EPA guidelines, now. Groundwater is being monitored a lot closer nowadays.

Recent samples of several wells throughout Northern Illinois, into southern Wisconsin have found that the majority of "contaminants" are from natural sources. The major **natural** contaminants are Radon, Radium and Arsenic. Radon gets into the body in a gaseous form. It comes out of the water when cooking and taking showers. Radium is also naturally occurring element that is formed by dissolution of minerals in rock left by the glaciers. Arsenic is found in Pyrite, which also was left behind by the glaciers. All natural events.

Again, not to alarm you but these are found before they enter any public treatment facility and are taken out before they reach your faucet. I found it interesting that the majority of contaminants were natural. It is not to say that man made contaminants should also me kept to a minimum like; pesticides, dumping of industrial waste, or even household products need to be kept in check, too. Although, the majority of the contaminants are from something we really do not have any control over. One control method is conservation of water to keep plenty of water in the aquifers to help dilute these contaminants and keep them at the safe levels.

FYI- for those who receive Lake Michigan water, these types of natural contaminants are rarely found.
