

February Greetings, Thanks to all of you

Thanks to all of you who were able to brave the cold weather and come out to the January Chapter meeting. We had an excellent presentation on high purity water systems and pH neutralization systems...and by the time this newsletter is sent out, hopefully the slides should be available to view on the

Chapter's website. Water purification systems is such a popular topic, that we will be focusing on other aspects of it at this month's meeting.

If any affiliates are interested in sponsoring the cocktail hour at one of our future meetings, please let me know. We currently have openings at our February and March meetings.

Also, we are looking for presenters for the 2016-2017 chapter year (which starts with our October 2016 meeting). If you are a member, please let me know what topics you are interested in hearing about. If you are a manufacturer's rep, let me know if you are interested in being a main presenter or doing the Manufacturer's Spotlight.

Our February Manufacturer's Spotlight will be by Mark Hall with Pentair Thermal Building Solutions. His presentation will cover Hot Water Temperature Maintenance utilizing heat trace cable technology as an alternative to recirculating systems. Discussion will include ways to conserve water waste by getting hot water faster, and lead innovation opportunities. He will also discuss energy savings and installation savings with heat trace systems.

Our main presenter will be Brian Soderholm, with Water Control, and he will be speaking on "Commercial High-Purity Water Systems and Applications", which will be worth 0.1 CEU. The presentation will focus on:

- Definitions and standards for high-purity water
- Distillation and how it works
- Deionization and how it works
- Electro-deionization and how it works
- · Membrane filtration (RO) and how it works
- Commercial reverse osmosis (RO) systems: required components
- Sizing/selection example for commercial RO system

Brian is Vice President of Water Control Corporation and works with new product and market development. Brian has a B.A. from Kalamazoo College in Economics and an MBA from the University of Minnesota. He has held his current position for 12 years and has over 22 years' experience in the construction and installation of commercial water treatment systems. For 44 years, Water Control has been an active player in the water treatment and conditioning industry, specializing in packaged water treatment systems for commercial, institutional, and industrial applications.

VICE PRESIDENT, LEGISLATIVE

Greetings Chicago Chapter

There is one particular code that is recommended to be included as part of the project plumbing notes. The cited code is being enforced by most of the state municipalities, as an addendum to the State of Illinois building code.

I am referring to the fact that existing underground plumbing pipe cannot just be abandoned in place. Over time, empty pipes rust and/or collapse creating a risk of structure failure. Removing piping as part of the demolition work, cutting floors, disconnecting and removing pipes, backfilling and patching the trench can be costly and very quickly can consume valuable time that was allocated for the demolition phase of the job.

However there is an alternative solution that is more cost effective and less time consuming. The pipe can remain abandoned in place, as long as the pipe is filled up entirely, to the point of disconnection with the supply or discharge mains. There are a few methods that can be specified on the plumbing notes, however the injection type is the one that it is the most effective. The preferred media is CLMS (Controlled Low-Strength Material) which has several generic names including: flow-able fill, lean-mix backfill, unshrinkable fill, flow-able mortar, and controlled-density fill (CDF). However, the name given to it by American Concrete Institute (ACI) Committee 229 seems to be gaining the most acceptance—(CLSM) Controlled Low-Strength Material. CLSM is not a concrete nor a soil-cement but it has properties similar to both. It is a self-compacted, cementitious material (Plastic soil-cement) used primarily as a backfill in lieu of compacted backfill. CLMS is composed of water, Portland cement, aggregate, and fly ash that has a compression resistance of 200 PSI. It's fluid characteristics allow it to be mixed with other solid fill materials for large pipes or basins. This product is also used to fill large voids such as old tunnels. It is recommended you refer to and coordinate with a structural engineer for the recommended specs for this or similar pipe filling products.

The 2015 IECC became effective in Illinois on January 1, 2016

The Capital Development Board (CDB), in conjunction with the Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (DCEO), has completed the cycle for the Illinois Energy Conservation Code (IECC) to update from the 2012 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) to the 2015 IECC. In accordance with The Energy Efficient Building Act, CDB is required to review and adopt the most current version of the IECC within one year after its publication date. The Code will then become effective within 6 months following its adoption by CDB. The effective date for the 2015 IECC, with Illinois Amendments, to become law in the State of Illinois was January 1, 2016.

We hear so many amazing stories about people celebrating their birthdays by packing at FMSC.


