

Some of those include another new venue in April when we go to Church Street Brewing Co in Itasca and another unique meeting experience at the Local 130 Training

Below are some key takeaways from the presentation:

- Elevated water distribution temperatures are a viable method to control Legionella when done correctly.
- Scalding is an elevated risk using this method, making it important to select the correct devices.
- Make sure you understand the difference between the ASSE valve standards depending on your project application.
- Make sure the minimum flow rating of the shower/tub valve you select is compatible with the flow rate of the shower head you are using.
- Pay close attention to the min/max ratings for flow and inlet temperatures on a selected mixing valve, as the ASSE compliance is not valid if the conditions in the field fall outside the values the valve is listed for.

Manufacturer's Spotlight: QuantumFlo Booster Pump Systems – Dave Bogot of Boilersource

Title of Presentation: COVID-19 Crisis Impact on Water

<u>Presentation Summary</u>: The result of COVID vacant and under-utilized buildings, Legionella headlines are populating the news outlets once again, but the story goes beyond Legionella. Poor quality water, sediment and biofilm filled piping leads to numerous waterborne pathogens and accounts for 30% of all hospital acquired infections. In this presenta-

tion we will explore how an orchestrated multi-barrier approach including both hot and cold-water systems can improve water quality and reduce the risk of Legionella, waterborne pathogens and HAIs. The presentation will include a closer dive into how non-detect Legionella levels can be achieved through chemical-free and "do no harm" technologies such as copper silver ionization.

<u>Presenter Bio</u>: Brian Croy has been involved in the healthcare industry for over 15 years and recently transitioned to LiquiTech last year. He covers the Midwest territory as a Business Development Director.

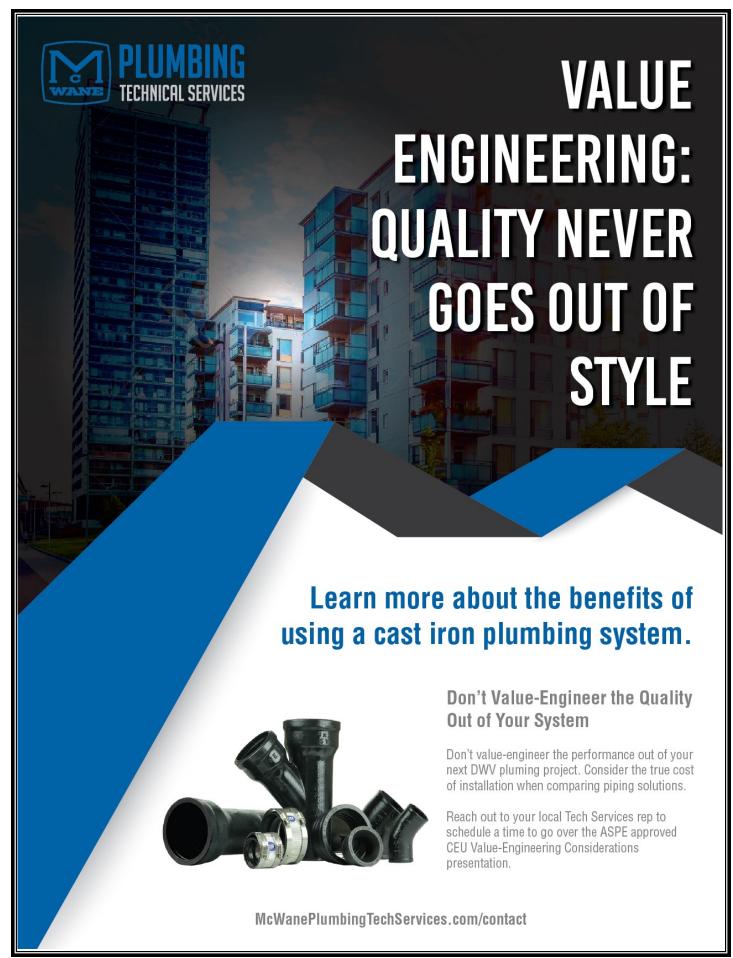

Hello Chicago Chapter Members!

This month's newsletter will attempt to cover the challenges that could be encountered when rehabilitating a building that is more than 20 years old.

Challenges with rehabilitating an "older" building:

Do you remember your first time working on a renovation project? The building may have been 30 or 40 years old and possibly your first thoughts were that it is as simple of a scope as the request for proposal (RFP) from the owner indicates. Maybe your boss gave you simple directions to follow and it seemed like clear and simple direction.

But then you start on the project and review the existing drawings. You might see and consider:

- Out of date existing drawings
- A lack of information on how large/deep foundation/footings are
- A lack of information on the material of the installed pipe
- Existing pipe is insulated with Asbestos
- Water closets that flush 3.5 GPF
- Urinals flushing more than a gallon
- Lavatories with a flow rate near 2 GPM
- Hot water recirculation not meeting modern day energy code; poor reaction time (the time a faucet is opened and hot water comes out) for fixtures

These are common items that need to be questioned, and should be identified early in the project. Walking the project site is strongly recommended and should be requested. To get eyes on the existing is the best way to confirm what is installed, and to confirm if the existing drawings are accurate.

Regarding foundations, these will never truly be known unless existing plans showing depth of footings are found. Not until construction begins at least. It's best to locate floor sinks/drains away from spread footings else the drain may not work and the floor plan may need to be re-adjusted. Note that as buildings become larger (multiple floors, all concrete structure) the spread footings become larger, the largest I've seen on drawings were 12'-0" x 12'-0" and had only 8" of fill between the slab and the top of footing. We were able to put lavatories and hand sinks near these large and shallow footings, but the floor drains had to be relocated. If you don't have the existing structure drawings, it's best to assume the footings are shallow.

Pipe materials are tougher to confirm without going to the site. Sometimes we can rely on the owner to obtain and share with us, other times it's an unknown. Performing a site observation usually would answer this question. If the pipes are insulated then it's a matter of tracing the lines, and at some point there will be valves or elbows or rough-ins that the pipe material can be seen. In my experience, if these pipes are one material then the insulated overhead is of the same material. We should not try to pull at insulation to uncover pipes, there are three reasons why this is wrong: we're there to observe, we want to leave the system exactly as it was when we arrived, or the insulation could be asbestos. Asbestos insulation is deadly, so especially if you're new to field observations – be careful! Field observations in recent months have been eye opening for me, I've always had heightened awareness at the presence of asbestos, however with the wearing of masks, I've felt more comfortable knowing the microfibers of asbestos have a chance to be caught at the mask before inhaling. It makes me think when we get past this current challenge in our lives that the mask might be part of my PPE. Do you remember lifting your first acoustical ceiling tile and receiving a shower of debris that was sitting on the ceiling? It never is pleasant. Protect yourselves out there.

Existing fixtures like water closets, urinals and lavatories/sinks consist of three main parts: the china, the carrier and the faucet/valve. During review of documents or of site observation photos, it is important to know what the flow rate of the installed fixtures are. Recently I worked on a project where the fixtures were all using large amounts of water, more water than current codes allow. The owner was wanting to keep the plumbing pipe and wall carriers in the walls as-is, but to replace the fixtures. I'll share with you what I learned from our manufacturer reps (next page).

- The water closets have historically been using the same wall carriers, there are 4 bolts coming through the wall and would allow for a new china fixture to be mounted to the existing wall carrier. The fixture would need to be replaced if you're opting to put in a low-flow flush valve because the fixture holds more water than modern fixtures that are designed to work with low-flow. It was explained to me that using a fixture intended for a 3.5 gpf valve but instead installing a 1.28 gpf valve would likely result in the fixture being activated 3 or 4 times before all the waste clears the trap.
- Urinals have had changes through the years and it's highly likely that the wall carrier would need to be removed if
 new china is needed. New china is needed if the existing fixture was intended to be used with higher flow rates.
 Similar to the water closet, if the fixture is older it would hold more water, so a change to a low flow flush valve
 without a matching low-flow fixture would result in the users flushing numerous times for the waste to clear the
 trap.
- Lavatories were the simplest to meet my client's request. The carrier and fixture were existing, however the china
 had 2 holes so it wasn't as simple as putting in the common sensor faucets we specify on a daily basis. To clarify,
 yes I suppose you could specify that faucet, however the faucet would be off center. Generally this is frowned upon. Luckily, now there are faucets available that manufacturers make to center the spout on the china. The water
 is supplied through one of the off-center holes and offsets through the faucet in a clean finish using sensor operation and low-flow.

It is great to have the reps in our network, they're helpful and have seen issues in the field. So when you call, that experience is able to be shared to make our projects more successful.

What challenges do you face on these types of projects? Are there any existing conditions I missed?

The process of updating the International Building Codes for the 2024 edition, is still underway. There have not been any recent updates from the Committee Action Hearings in Spring, I will be continually monitoring this.

There has been no action related to the State of Illinois Plumbing Code. Additionally, there are no scheduled Illinois Plumbing Code Advisory Council Meetings. If that changes, I will let you know. 


