A special thank you goes out to Todd Spurlin for his informative presentation on HUD / FHA Requirements for Multi-Family Dwellings. Below are some key takeaways from the presentation:

- The Fair Housing Act (FHA) is a law, not a building code.
- FHA applies to all multi-family buildings with 4 or more units in one building
- FHA applies to every dwelling unit served (accessed) by an elevator
- Showers must have 36" x 36" finished inside clear minimum. Often 38" x 38" pans are needed for field fabricated shower stalls
- Make sure 30" x 48" clear space is provided in front of showers. The space must be clear of any bump outs from the face of the shower

Title of presentation: Not All Alloys are Created Equal

Presentation Summary:

There are many valve materials to choose from when designing for commercial plumbing however it can be difficult to decipher the features and benefits to each material. The Safe Water Drinking Act of 2014 changed the way valves are manufactured and as a result changed the valve material components that are now on specifications. This presentation will explore the differences between the varieties of materials commonly chosen for design including the realization that some materials labeled as bronze technically are a brass material according to the Copper Institute.




2022-2023 Chapter Meetings and Beyond

VICE PRESIDENT, LEGISLATIVE



Greetings Chicago Chapter Members!

In the spirit of our December meeting's Casino night, I've got a few design ideas that Engineers 'gamble' on if they don't ask the AHJ prior to designing and stamping the drawings. How dangerous do you like to play?

City of Chicago Updates:

The changes to the City of Chicago Plumbing Code are now legally a part of the code as of March 1st. I would recommend reading through the changes in the link below in advance of working on your projects in the city. There are reports of in-construction projects having field inspectors trying to enforce the amendments despite the projects being permitted prior to the amendments passing. Stay vigilant out there!

Also, I've heard two rumors of pending changes to the code. One rumor would shock the plumbing world and the other rumor would be bringing back an old requirement. If any of you hear of new ideas/whims coming from the field, please do share. The rumors I'll keep between us until code amendments are proposed through the typical code amendment process!

Four building design aspects you can gamble on:

- 1. If the model code for your project allows you to use either PVC or cast iron on your underground sanitary pipe, do you decide which pipe material you will specify? Or rather, who decides this for you?
 - a. There are many layers to this question that can be discussed, so follow along with me and try to give me the benefit of understanding the point trying to be made. It could save you from litigation by critically thinking about what you're doing, or what to check when you're Quality Controlling another engineer's work.
 - b. Your company's standard could be to use PVC whenever your project is not in the City of Chicago. This is admirable in the attempts to save cost for your project. Vice-versa, it could be your company's standard to always use cast iron because you're in the City of Chicago or that's just what your firm does.
 - c. I am of the opinion that neither pipe material is superior to the other, rather they each have their place. Around your water heaters and boilers, you want to use cast iron pipe to preclude the possibility of too-hot-of-water entering your drainage system because PVC melts above 140°F. It's expensive to replace buried pipe, so cast iron is safer and to require the installer to have at least 10' of cast iron pipe from each of these drains/sources. If your project is being built near the ocean, in the water table, at an old gas station or any location with corrosive soils, use of cast iron could be a fatal mistake. Either wrap your cast iron with corrosive protection, or using PVC would be better.
 - d. Sharing these assumptions in a narrative with the owner to give them the opportunity to respond to your firm's recommendations is a way to shift liability away from you.
- If you have an underground sanitary/storm pipe with a size in excess of 8" diameter, at what point do you drop a manhole within the building?
 - a. International Plumbing Code Chapter 7 tells us if the pipe is 8" or larger, then manholes shall be used in lieu of floor cleanouts. It's fairly easy to get an 8" storm pipe on large buildings. Are you complying with code and dropping manholes, or are you skirting this requirement and using wall/floor cleanouts when the 8" storm pipe goes underground? If you use typical cleanouts, are you asking the AHJ for written permission or are you notifying the owner on the assumption in case it is flagged during construction? Protect yourself out there!
- 3. When sizing your water supply piping, do you use the water supply fixture unit method to size each segment of the water supply system? Or rather, have you done away with WSFUs and used engineering judgment to specify a smaller pipe than Code's WSFU method would direct you?

- a. In the September 2021 VP Legislative's article, I shared issues with oversizing pipe if you follow code. Looking at lavatories, they are required to flow less than 0.5 GPM but have a WSFU factor of 1.5. If you have a bank of lavatories, code could tell you that an 1-1/4" hot and cold supply is required. But the flowrates split between hot and cold could prove that a 3/4" on each would be sufficient if 100% of the lavatories are in simultaneous use. An argument could be made that only ~50% of a bank of lavatories could be expected to be used simultaneously, but is that enough protection to specify only 1/2" supply lines?
- b. At what point do you bring up legionella and bacteria control by promoting the reduction of pipe size to increase velocities for increased scouring?
- c. This is an area of improved engineering that we all can work on. I know numerous people smarter than me are looking into this to re-write the code to allow for exemptions to give you and I the tools necessary to more accurately size our water systems with engineering judgment. But until that day, design below code minimums at your own risk!
- 4. Do you heat your water to a minimum of 140°F and distribute this water without the protection of an ASSE 1017 master mixing valve?
 - a. I'm often conflicted on the necessity of an ASSE 1017 master mixing valve. My water heater reps say the water heaters I specify have an internal aquastat that keeps the water in the tank to the temperature I require with a ±2-3°F tolerance. So why put in the ASSE 1017 valve, right? I'm learning that it comes down to shift in liability, the ASSE 1017 standard requires valves to prove they balance the water temperature to a tighter tolerance in a short timeframe. Relying solely on the water heater's tolerance increases your chances of litigation in the event of scalding. Reach out to your reps to learn more! In general, if you're heating water only to ~130°F then maybe you don't need the master mixing valve. But if you have aerating showers, or are concerned with Legionella in your water supplies, creating water at a higher temperature and distributing at a different temperature is safer in a couple design aspects.

What do you think? I'd love to have a discussion about any or all of these opinions, I'm here to learn and to share what I'm learning.

The process of updating the International Building Codes for the 2024 edition, is still underway. There have not been any recent updates from the Committee Action Hearings in Spring, I will be continually monitoring this.

There has been no action related to the State of Illinois Plumbing Code. Additionally, there are no scheduled Illinois Plumbing Code Advisory Council Meetings. If that changes, I will let you know. 
