## **A CELEBRATION OF PLUMBING DESIGN FEATURE PROJECT!**

Engineer/Designer Name: Chris Winnie, P.E., CPD Engineer/Designer Company: SmithGroup

We've all had at least one of those projects that we've designed or were a part of that holds a special place in our career. Whether it's the first time you're given design lead, the first construction site visit, or maybe some project that has a complexity/uniqueness that sticks out, these are the projects that keep us excited to be in this industry. Here is my story, what's yours?

The first project that I was involved in the conceptual and schematic design phases was a dental school project. It wasn't my first dental school, so I had experience with the nuances of oral evacuation and how messy of a system it is. It's a gravity system, and don't let other people tell you otherwise! Typically, dental schools have operatories (dental chairs) on upper levels with a basement below so the oral evacuation can be minimally pitched to the air/water separator tank.

On my second dental school, though, there was no basement and the first level had operatories! There was an idea to collect a row of chairs' oral evacuation pipe and rise the pipe vertically to the ceiling and let the vacuum pull the sludge up and through. I rejected this thought immediately because I knew dental chairs close their vacuum inlet after a procedure, so sludge would fall by gravity, congeal and could harden such that the pipe gets blocked.

Being involved in the project so early, I was able to navigate these limitations with the project team and the Architect such that Structural dropped their footings, Mechanical moved their equipment to the penthouse, Architecture depressed a large area in the mechanical room and provided a ship's ladder and guard rail so that a large air/water separator tank could be dropped into this "pit".

I haven't been to the site to punch walk yet, but here is a photo after the tank arrived on site and was dropped into the pit. I'm proud that the inverts for the oral evacuation worked out and the tank could be placed and piped together.



I'm my own worst critic, so I'm constantly looking to improve any system and any design. If you take a look at this image, the clearances on the cutsheet are met, but more clearance around the tank would have been useful. Words of advice...add more buffer to the "minimum" clearances early on.

Hopefully mother nature doesn't have any major wintry weather cued up for us between now and spring! Don't worry, I am knocking on wood as I type this!

Thank you to everyone that came out last month to Moretti's in Edison Park! We had 72 attendees (80 RSVP), the largest turnout for a general meeting that we've had since at least 2013! Was it the loca-

tion? The presentation? I am going to assume it was a combination of both based on the feedback we received but would love to hear your thoughts.

Thank you very much to Nathan Buss and Merit Brass for sponsoring our Cocktail Hour and for participating in our Manufacturer Spotlight this month! A special thank you goes out to Julius Ballanco for his great presentation on *How YOU can Make an Impact on Codes & Standards*. I hope those in attendance were motivated by the presentation to go out and get involved, armed with all the valuable information Julius provided. Below are some key takeaways from the presentation:

- Anyone can propose a code change!
- A code only becomes a legal document when adopted by the Federal Government, a State, or a local authority.
- The process to submit code changes is easier with the ICC than IAPMO.
- If you submit a code change to the ICC, staff will review your proposal and reach out to you to help improve the chances of success.
- The code change cycle for the 2027 ICC codes will begin in 2024.
- You can submit code changes to the ASPE Legislative Committee to review and comment on. ASPE may choose to support your proposed change, giving you a better chance of success.
- Anyone can propose changes to plumbing standards at any time, as there is typically not a specific cycle for those standards.

#### Title of presentation: Safety First! Specifying Emergency Showers & Eyewashes

#### City of Chicago Updates:


Last month, we discussed the air chambers being added back to code. I don't have anything new this month to share.

#### Two design aspects I want to discuss:

1. Do you put cleanouts on subsoil drainage?

In our model codes, subsoil drainage is mentioned in the storm drain chapter and cleanouts for the storm drainage chapter references the sanitary chapter. However, subsoil drainage is listed as an "exception" and thus need not have cleanouts. How about that? My worries start not with the potential for clogs, but rather – how does the owner know if their SSD pipe has been compromised? Also, the system should not be rodded or jet-cleaned from what I hear – the pipes are loosely attached together, here's a detail I frequently use:



For those at home reading thinking, "what is a subsoil drainage system???" The subsoil drainage system is a system that alleviates the potential hydrostatic pressure from building up, normally infrequent, but gets increasingly frequent the closer you get to the water table. The system also is connected to a sump pump typically; else if it drains by gravity the system is required to have a backwater valve. Of note, if your home has a basement it likely has this system connected to a sump pump!

2. How much attention do you pay to insulation on underground water pipes in your specifications, general notes and project manual?

I was on a pre-construction underground meeting some time ago where we were discussing all of the systems being routed underground. We had oral evacuation, dental compressed air, sanitary, storm, vent, domestic cold, domestic hot and recirculation piping underground because we had no full height walls for a large open space with sinks and dental chairs. The call was primarily to discuss how the dental air and oral evacuation pipe would be installed, but as the call was wrapping up I innocently asked how they would insulate the ~1,000 feet of underground potable water.

The response: "We don't insulate underground water pipe."

Things got serious really quick. Sure, domestic cold water need not be insulated but to be covered with a film so the soils don't wear away at the copper. But the hot water supply and recirculation?! Just think of all that heat transfer as the BTUs flow into the ground. They'd never get hot water out of the faucets. We were able to work out on the call two solutions to insulating underground piping because insulation can't get wet. What do you do insulate underground hot water?
